

Road safety remains one of Eswatini's most urgent public concerns. Every year, lives are lost and families shattered due to preventable road crashes. As the country works towards the global goal of halving serious injuries and fatalities by 2030; as outlined in the Decade of Action for Road Safety; it's time to confront two major threats on our roads: Speeding and distractions.

The SMVAF continues to champion awareness through the 'Drop the Call' campaign, reminding all road users that safety begins with attention and responsibility.

SPEED: DEADLY MISCALCULATION

Speeding is not just a traffic violation; it's a leading cause of death on Eswatini's roads. Whether on highways or in residential areas,



driving too fast reduces reaction time, increases stopping distance and amplifies the force of impact in a crash.

Many drivers underestimate the danger of exceeding speed limits. A vehicle travelling at 80km/h takes nearly twice as long to stop as one going 50km/h. In emergencies, those extra seconds can mean the difference between life and death.

Speed limits are designed to protect everyone, drivers, passengers, pedestrians and cyclists. They are not arbitrary numbers but calculated thresholds based on road conditions, visibility and traffic density. Ignoring them puts lives at risk.

DISTRACTIONS: HIDDEN DANGER BEHIND THE WHEEL

Mobile phone use while driving is a growing and deadly habit. Whether texting, scrolling, or answering calls, distracted driving is equivalent to driving blindfolded for several seconds: enough time to cause a fatal crash.

The SMVAF's 'Drop the Call' campaign urges motorists to silence or stow their phones before starting the engine. Hands-free devices are no safer; cognitive distraction impairs judgment and slows reaction time. No mes-

Studies show that drivers using phones are four times more likely to be involved in a crash. The solution is simple: Focus on the road. If a call is urgent, pull over safely before answering. Your full attention belongs behind the wheel.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY: STAY ALERT, **STAY ALIVE**

Pedestrians are increasingly vulnerable, especially as mobile devices become more integrated into daily life. Walking while texting, streaming, or wearing earphones can be just as dangerous as distracted driving.

Many pedestrian accidents occur because individuals fail to notice oncoming traffic, ignore signals, or cross roads without checking for vehicles. The use of gadgets impairs both hearing and vision, making it harder to detect danger.

Pedestrians must remain vigilant. Use designated crossings, obey traffic signals and avoid distractions when near roadways. Make eye contact with drivers before crossing and never assume a vehicle will stop. Awareness is your best defence.

The open road may tempt you to push the pedal a little harder, but resist the urge and keep it safe. The real thrill of a road trip is arriving alive to enjoy every moment of the journey.

EVERYONE HAS A ROLE TO PLAY

Road safety is a shared responsibility. Government agencies, civil society and every citizen must work together to create safer streets. The SMVAF continues to invest in education, emergency response and victim support; but prevention starts with behaviour change.

TOWARDS SAFER FUTURE

The Decade of Action for Road Safety sets a bold but achievable target: reducing road deaths and serious injuries by 50% by 2030. Eswatini can lead the way; but only if we all commit to change.

Whether you're behind the wheel or on foot. remember: Drop the call, drop the speed and raise your awareness. Lives depend on it.



HERE are few places that capture the raw beauty of nature quite like the Ngwenya Mountains. This November, walkers are invited to join naturalist Kate Braun for a scenic exploration of wildflowers and sweeping landscapes at Malolotja Nature Reserve.

66 ...join naturalist Kate Braun for a scenic wildflower walk through Malolotja's breathtaking landscapes.

The walk will begin at the Ngwenya entrance to Malolotja where participants will park near the old open-cast mine before setting off towards the dramatic slopes of the Ngwenya Mountains. From here, the views stretch across the Steynsdorp Valley into South Africa offering a spectacular panorama over Hawane and onto Fonteyn in Mbabane. The outlook also takes in the Diepgezet Valley and the distant Makhonjwa Mountains with Emlembe rising proudly at Bulembu.

With the recent rains expected to bring a burst of colour the grasslands should be alive with blooms showing their full splendour. The route passes from the edge of the mined area through open grassland to a small rocky ridge of soapstone. Depending on time the group may explore the southern hilltop of the Ngwenya ridge to take in even more breathtaking scenery.

This is a short and gentle walk designed to allow plenty of time to enjoy the flowers and the views. It is suitable for families and for those seeking a relaxed morning in nature. More adventurous walkers may later explore the ridge along the border though this will not be part of the NHSe walk on this occasion.

Participants should meet at the Theatre Club at 7:30am for a prompt 7:45am departure or at the Ngwenya gate at 8:15am. Bring a backpack, at least 1.5 litres of water, snacks, sun protection including a broad-brimmed hat and E50 per person for entry to Malolotja. Hiking poles are recommended. Expect around 30 minutes of travel each way and up to three hours of walking.

This family-friendly outing promises an invigorating blend of gentle exercise and natural beauty. Please note that dogs are not permitted as it is a protected nature reserve. 

la Nature Reserve, the Shewula bird hide is a must-visit for birdwatchers seeking both tranquillity and adventure. Covering 2,650 hectares of land set aside by the local community for conservation, the reserve forms part of the Lubombo Conservancy, a region celebrated for its remarkable biodiversity and scenic landscapes.

Nestled in a thriving wethide offers an exceptant to observe around 250 bird

that call this area home. Among the most commonly spotted are the striking Purple-crested Turaco, the delicate Green Twinspot, the melodic Black-headed Oriole, as well as an impressive array of raptors and waterbirds. The calm setting invites visitors to slow down, listen to nature's chorus and enjoy an authentic Lowveld experience.

The reserve is also home to the Shewula Mountain Camp, a community-run eco-lodge perched atop the majestic Lubombo Mountains. From this spectacular location, visitors can gaze down to the Indian Ocean on a clear day and across Eswatini's sweeping plains to the Malolotja Mountains in the west. It's an ideal base for exploring both the

wetlands below and the cultural richness of the Shewula community.

Whether you're a seasoned birder or a nature enthusiast seeking peace and perspective, the Shewula bird hide offers a rare chance to connect deeply with Eswatini's wild beauty.

...SHEWULA MOUNTAIN CAMP EXPERIENCE



GROUP of archaeologists, German mostly, Canadian and American led by Culture Consultant Bob Forrester; finished a month of archaeology fieldwork in Mlawula Nature Reserve.

The group of archeologists was invited by Eswatini National Trust Commission (ENTC).

Their excavation of Khabane Cave revealed exceptional levels of preservation, thanks to the cave's unusually dry soils.

Thousands of archeological stone tools were found. Remarkably, even 'dassie droppings dating back thousands of years appear almost fresh, while ancient leaves and twigs remain so well preserved that they can still be identified,' wrote Your Environment Eswatini on their Facebook post. Such conditions are considered extremely rare in southern Africa, making Khabane Cave an invaluable archaeological site.

Beyond the excavation, the team also engaged in capacity building workshop. The workshop was hosted by the ENTC and engaged communities and Eswatini Tourism Authority, University of Eswatini and

others. They conducte da handson training workshop for students, hosted an information session for Members of Parliament at Khabane and travelled across the country applying advanced scientific techniques to Bushman paintings. Using a portable X-ray device and handheld Raman machines that fire harmless laser beams, they were able to analyse the pigments without causing any damage

The archeologists carried out analyses to uncover the materials behind the ancient paint. Using a portable X-ray device and handheld Raman machines that beam lasers, they examined the Bushman paintings up close.

Spotted Spreadwing



URING the hottest and coolest times of the day, Spotted Spreadwings are mostly inactive and spend long periods hanging vertically from emergent grass stems. At mid-morning, the males are often very active as they chase each other from stem to stem. The females are frequently seen with the males. Spotted Spreadwings are easily overlooked. Their bluegrey colouration and slender bodies blend perfectly with the grass and glare from the water.

The Spotted Spreadwing is most active from September to May.

DISTRIBUTION

It is native to much of the southern half of Africa, where it is widespread, but localised. Its range also extends to East and Central Africa, and parts of West Africa.



Wildlife Photography 2025: Nature's Wonders Through the Lens

Each year, the Wildlife Photographer of the Year competition reminds us that the natural world still holds extraordinary stories waiting to be seen. The 2025 winners have once again revealed the patience, passion and artistry that define true wildlife photography, capturing rare moments that blend science with beauty.

WE ONLY PICKED THREE FROM THE WINNERS;

Behaviour: Invertebrates - The Towering Caterpillar by Georgina Steytler

After years of searching, photographer Georgina Steytler finally encountered the elusive caterpillar she had been hoping to find. The clues were subtle but clear, eucalyptus trees with skeletonised leaves, proof that the tiny grazer had been at work. She seized the moment at sunset, framing the insect in a backlit glow while using a fill-in flash to reveal its living head beneath an extraordinary structure of old head capsules. Each layer of this natural helmet was retained through

Behaviour: Mammals - The Caracal's Unseen Hunt by Dennis **Stogsdill**

While tracking wild cats near Ndutu Lake, Stogsdill expected to find a serval. Instead, he witnessed a scene that few have ever documented, a caracal hunting

wading lesser flamingos. Known for their powerful leaps and diverse diet that ranges from insects to antelope, caracals are masters of stealth and agility. Yet this moment went beyond expectation as the cat prowled the lakeshore, moving with precision before striking its vibrant prey. The resulting image is both graceful and shocking, offering a rare record of adaptability and predatory skill in motion.

Young Wildlife Photographer of the Year - The Beetle and the Beech by Andrea Dominizi

Dominizi spotted a longhorn beetle resting on weathered bark in Italy. Once an area heavily logged for old beech trees, the forest now tells a story of loss and resilience. Longhorn beetles play a vital ecological role, tunnelling into dead wood and allowing fungi to enter, which in turn helps recycle nutrients back into the soil. It captures not just the beauty of the beetle but the delicate balance that sustains forest life. When habitats vanish, so too do the unseen threads that hold entire ecosystems together.

These images are more than technical triumphs; they are visual testaments to the intricate and fragile web of life that surrounds us, a reminder that even the smallest creatures have stories worth telling.

UCKED away from the main roads, Buhleni Farm Chalets is a haven of peace and quiet (so much so that many locals are not aware of its existence!). There are 9 wooden chalets, each with its own braai, set apart for privacy. Ideal for businessmen needing to unwind or families too. The campsite is spacious and quiet, with shaded trees, a fully equipped camp kitchen/braai area, and a quirky, delightful ablution block.




