

Umhlanga Reed Dance Ceremony: 2-8 September 2025 ...this is a vibrant spectacle, a riot of colours as bright as spring blossoms. It's a celebration of the Imbali as they come into their own.

EADY to witness the *Imbali* blossom? The Umhlanga, or Reed Dance Ceremony, is set to take place from September 2 to 8, 2025, with the Main Day of celebrations on 8 September.

The Imbali is a regiment of young girls who are eligible to fetch the reed (Umhlanga) during this annual cultural event. The ceremony honours these girls for maintaining their chastity, providing a unique opportunity for them to showcase their purity before Their Majesties and the entire world.

This is a vibrant spectacle, a riot of colours as bright as spring blossoms. It's a celebration of the Imbali as they come into their own. You will see columns (ticheme) of girls, advancing like vast, ululating centipedes across the parade grounds of the Ludzidzini arena. One by one, they dissolve into the pulsating mass of bodies around the royal kraal.

Up close, it's an almost overwhelming immersion in noise and colour. The girls stamp, sing and sway in unison, their anklets rattling, their

More than just a dance: A call for change


The Umhlanga is not just a dance, it's a platform for the young women to raise pressing social issues. This year, they have adopted the powerful slogan: 'Siyimbali yemaSwati, sichakazile sitakuncoba kuhlukubeteka.' This translates to: 'We are the pride of the nation; we will conquer gender-based violence'.

Their poignant song expresses concern about the pervasive nature of GBV, which continues to affect girls and women without an adequate legal or societal response. They highlight that the country's laws remain ineffective in addressing this issue and have called for harsher penalties, including a life sentence for perpetrators.



Eswatini to roll out e-visa system



Landing page of the e-visa system. This portal was expected to enhance ease of travel to Eswatini and boost the tourism industry.

SWATINI is set to revolutionise its immigration process with a new e-visa system, moving beyond the traditional hassle of passport stamps

Chief Immigration Officer Mthokozisi Dlamini announced the development at the inaugural Eswatini Tourism Nkwe Indaba in Ezulwini, revealing that the system is in an advanced stage.

Dlamini said the Home Affairs Ministry is finalising an Immigration Bill that will include provisions for the new system. The e-visa will allow travellers to apply online, replacing traditional passport stamps and stickers with a digital record linked to their passports.

Once the system is live, visa holders will be able to generate a unique share code for verification, simplifying travel, work, study and residency processes. The digital upgrade is also expected to enhance security and reduce the risk of losing or damaging important travel documents.

This innovative approach promises to streamline entry into the country, making it quicker and more secure for visitors and officials alike.



HE Butimba is one of Eswatini's most striking royal traditions, a ceremonial hunt led by His Majesty King Mswati III that unites warriors from across the nation in a display of unity, discipline

and cultural pride. Often hosted at Hlane Royal National Park, it honours Swati heritage, reinforces the bond between the monarchy and the regiments; reflecting a deep respect for leadership and the natural world.

More than a hunt, Butimba serves as a living tradition — an enduring expression of identity and ecological values that continue to define the Swati people. The ceremony highlights the importance of sustainable game management, with traditional practices observed to ensure balance between cultural heritage and wildlife conservation. It also raises awareness about preserving Eswatini's rich biodiversity for future generations.

TRADITION RECLAIMED

Remarkably, the Butimba almost faded into history. In the 1960s, game numbers had fallen so drastically that annual hunts yielded little more than cane rats and hares. Yet King Sobhuza II recognised the cultural importance of this ancient ritual and ordered the protection of Hlane under Macobane's stewardship.

This conservation philosophy, likened to safeguarding a cow that provides a surplus of milk each year, ensured the regeneration of wildlife.

Today, Hlane's protected core sustains thriving game populations, giving fresh meaning and vitality to the Butimba.

MORE THAN CEREMONY

While deeply ceremonial, the Butimba also complements other major national events such as the Incwala and Umhlanga. It is a vibrant reminder that Eswatini's traditions are not static relics but living








Challenge! Spot September Bells



- Scientific Name: Rubiaceae Ixoroideae Gardenieae
- Siswati Name: sikobe

F the warmer temperatures aren't enough to inspire you to explore the wild, perhaps the September Bells will! Take a stroll through your backyard or hike your nearest mountain to see if you can spot this beautiful plant.

DESCRIPTION

The September Bells is a graceful shrub characterised by its slender branches, some of which are very finely downy. This hardy, evergreen (sometimes briefly deciduous) shrub can grow into a well-shaped small tree with attractive bark that becomes neatly squared with age. It features dark green glossy leaves and produces clusters of magnificent, white, bell-shaped, sweetly scented flowers from August to November.

It is often in full bloom in September, hence the common name – September Bells.

The large, round, leathery green fruits are sweet and juicy, but turn hard and woody when dry. Notably, the juice from these fruits, which stains blue, is traditionally used to heal wounds and burns.

This plant thrives as an understory shrub beneath larger trees that provide light shade, such as Acacia species.

Hint where to spot it: Malolotja Nature Reserve.





ROTHMANNIA GLOBOSA (SEPTEMBER BELL) FRUIT: The specific name globosa means roundish and refers to the shape of the fruit.



The scented bell-shaped flowers are creamy white, usually with pink speckles in the throat, and are borne singly or in clusters of 2 to 4 on short side branches.

Best birding spots





MBULUZI GAME RESERVE

This reserve, situated in the Lowveld bush, is home to some of the finest birds. It's a birding paradise with over 300 species of birds that have been recorded. This includes rare species such as dwarf bittern, Narina trogon, African finfoot, grey-headed kingfisher, African cuckoo-hawk, Eurasian hobby, and thick-billed cuckoo.





DOMBEYA GAME RESERVE

Now this reserve is a sanctuary for precious birds such as pink-throated twinspots and cuckoos. It boasts more than 220 bird species and is still counting. As a reserve that encourages biodiversity, it is fast becoming a home to some interesting species such as the striped kingfisher, the grey waxbill, the African cuckoo and the black-chested snake eagle.

MALOLOTJA NATURE RESERVE

More than 280 species of birds have been recorded and its is an ideal breeding spot for many endangered birds, including the blue swallow, blue crane and Stanley's bustard. The reserve also excitingly contains rare species such as striped flufftails and black-rumped buttonquails.

Raptors of wide variety, including stunning martial eagles, bateleurs, and long-crested eagles, can be spotted here.




